Key Areas of Learning

As **Historians** we will continue to develop our chronological understanding of British history and in particular, the changes in Britain from the Stone Age through to the Iron Age. We will learn how people from this time period lived, what they believed in and what was important to them.

As **Artists** we will design Stone Age outfits and use natural materials to dye fabrics. We will study cave paintings and create our own stencils and prints.

As **Writers** we will use our knowledge of Early Britain to create information books with an index and glossary and write adventure stories inspired by our class text, Stone Age Boy. We will continue to develop our writing by proposing changes in grammar and vocabulary and proof reading for spelling and punctuation errors.

ENGLISH

Text: Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura

Non-fiction skills: information books with index and glossary

Narrative: Adventure stories, letter writing, play scripts

Poetry: performance

Spelling: further homophones, statutory words & revision of previously taught suffixes & prefixes

Grammar & Punctuation: conjunctions, verb tenses: past, present, progressive & present perfect

Division: divide 2-digits by 1-digit

Measurement: measure, add & compare length, mass & capacity
