Autumn Term**




Key Areas of Learning

As **Historians**, we will be learning about the great historical period of the Saxons. These invaders turned settlers produced the most famous monarch ever ... the only one to be called 'Great', King Alfred. We'll also look at some of the most spectacular finds and learn about how the Saxon's lived and hopefully answer the question of 'Sutton Who'?

As **writers**, we will be putting our creative hats and delving into a collection of books all around King Arthur. We will be following the stories of King Arthur written by Marcia Williams, Tony Bradman & Tony Ross and many more. We will be working with the books, focusing on writing fiction with our focus of describing already known characters and even making our own character. We will also be exploring the Anglo-Saxon form of poetry in the style of kennings.

As **Scientists**, we will be looking at *animals including humans* during the first term, from mammals to reptiles, birds to amphibians. We will be also be looking at the structure of the human body, muscles and bones galore.
